



Increase in Development in Chelsea & Everett



In 2018, Chelsea schools had a 16.5% "churn" rate—the percentage of students who transferred either into or out of the school district in that year (1,131 students).	
Everett's churn rate was 19.0% (1,492 students), and Revere's rate was 14.4% (1,162 students). All of these rates are higher than the statewide average, which was 10.2%	Mass DoE
